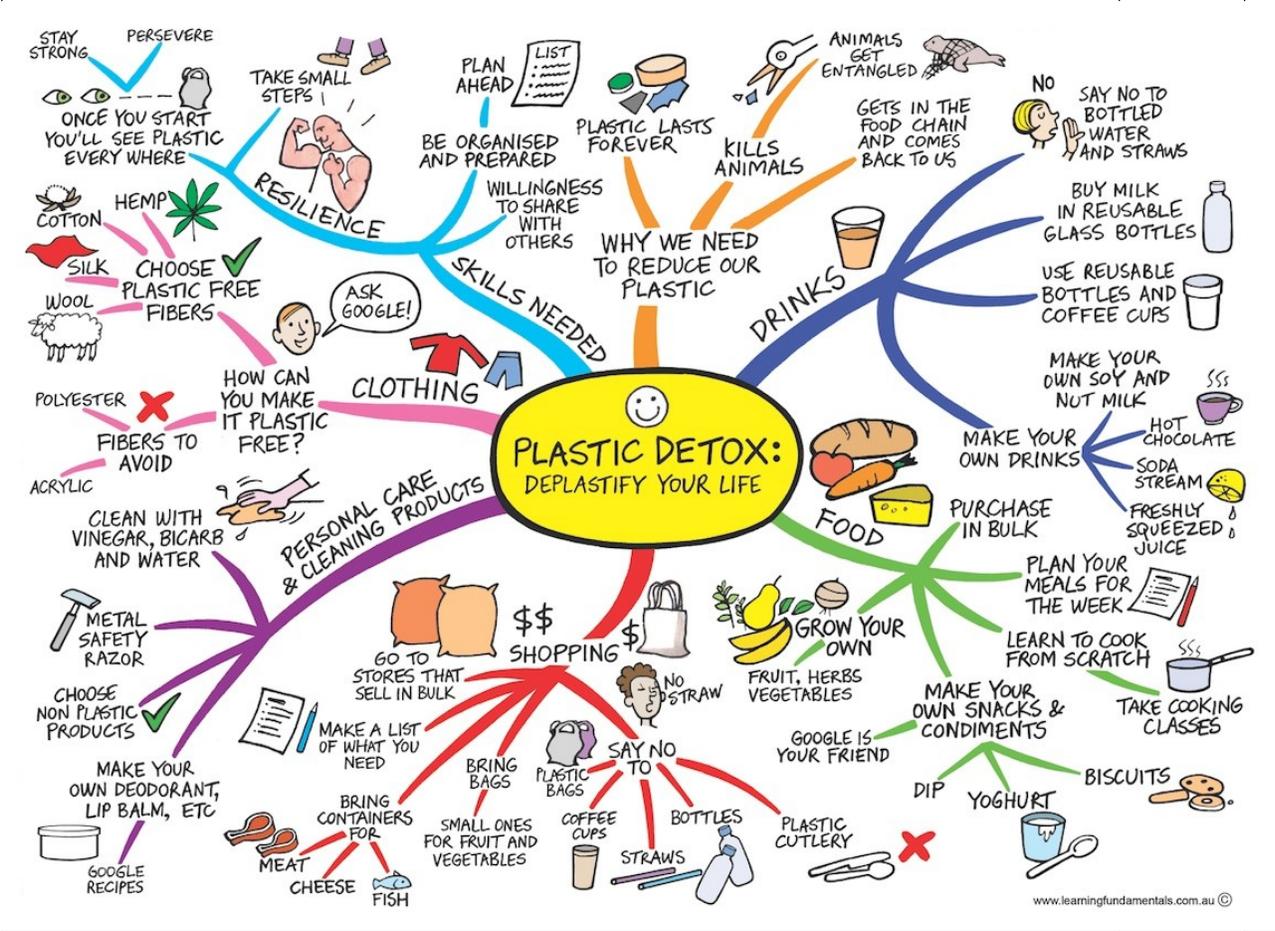

Larry had no experience working in kitchens, but the supervisor who hired him, explained that it wasn't necessary, because they would train him.</p> <p>On Larry's first day, he was paired with a Senior Line Cook by the name of Tyler. Tyler wasn't especially thrilled with the idea of having to train a new guy on the busiest night of the week, and expressed his concerns to the manager. "You're our most senior employee, so that makes you the most qualified person to do the training." A frustrated Tyler didn't say much after that – and aside from giving Larry a nod of acknowledgement, his only words to him were "watch, and stay out of my way."</p> <p>By the time the main dinner rush hit, the entire kitchen line was bustling with activity and Tyler was doing his best to call orders, time out bills, and cook all at the same time. As more and more orders came in, the stress level in the kitchen had increased dramatically.
