Consider the following product mix problem:

Let x1 denote number of units of Product 1 to be produced daily and x2 the number of units of Product 2 to be produced daily. The production of Product 1 requires one hour of processing time in department D1. Production of 1 unit of Product 2 requires 2 hours of processing time in department D1 and one hour in department D2. The number of hours available in department D1 are 32 hours and in department D2, 8 hours. The contribution of one unit of Product 1 is Rs. 200 and of Product 2 is Rs. 300.
